to helping your child grow, learn, and achieve great gains this year and hope that


you will partner with us. You are an important teacher in your child's life and we that the minutes you spend together are critical.

SCHOOL REMINDERS

The Ohio Department of Education requires that we keep careful track of student attendance each day. If you child comes to school late, be sure to sign him/her in at the office before the child proceeds to the classroom. Any child who is not signed in will be considered unexcused. Daily attendance will be calculated according to the time of day your child arrives at school.

ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE SCHEDULE

Enter from 9:11-10:50 - Tardy

Enter from 10:51-12:20 - 1/2 Day Absent

Enter from 12:21-3:30 - Absent day

Leave before 12:20 - Absent all day

Leave from 12:21-1:54 - Absent half day

Leave from 1:55-3:30 - Early dismissal

Parents must follow the proper procedures for arrival and dismissal. These rules are in place to ensure the safety of your children. When you choose not to obey the rules, you put your child and other children in jeopardy.

Please be reminded that when you drop off your child(ren) in the morning, you are to make the loop around the parking lot, wait in line, and then drop your child(ren) off at the sidewalk. Parents are not permitted to pull into a parking spot to let your child(ren) out of the car. You must make the loop and let them out at the sidewalk.

For dismissal, if you are picking up your child, you must park your car and come into the building. You cannot have your child meet you at your car in the parking lot. Please know how easily an accident can happen. We are dealing with children who can quickly dart out in front of a car. These procedures ae established for the protection of all children. We know the weather can be cold or rainy, but if you choose to pick up your child, please follow the above procedure.

It is the responsibility of parents to follow these rules. There is no supervision of parking lot procedures and therefore our children's safety depends on you. Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Dear Parents,

We know that birthdays are a momentous and special occasion in your child's life. We look forward to celebrating birthdays with our students and enjoy the special feeling that exudes from your child on his/her special day each year. In an effort to move away from the overabundance of food and potentially dangerous food ingredients in schools however, we kindly encourage you to consider sending in alternative "treats" with your son/daughter on birthdays. Non-food item "treats" are not only great alternatives to overly processed and unhealthy snacks, but they also help to protect individuals (kids *AND* adults) in our school building who have allergies and food sensitivities.

Below are suggestions for non-food items to send in with your child in place of an edible treat on a birthday celebration day:

Pencils

Bookmarks

Erasers

Stickers

Temporary tattoos

Pencil grips

Note pads

A game/puzzle for the classroom

Bouncy balls

We ask that if you do decide to send in an edible food item that it be a premade/packaged treat and **NOT** something that was baked or made in the home. Reading labels is the most effective way we as educators can be familiar with the ingredients we are exposing students to in our classrooms and this practice will help us to better ensure the safety of the little lives we hold near and dear to our hearts. 
