



Delivering a first-class education for generations, Chardon Local Schools is committed to high student achievement utilizing great teachers and rigorous curriculum design.

The school district can trace its founding to a log school house erected in 1815. Today the district educates students across six school buildings; Chardon High School (Grades 9-12), Chardon Middle School (Grades 6-8), Hambden, Maple, Munson and Park Elementary Schools (Grades K-5). The 2014-15 enrollment is approximately 3,000 students.

Since the inception of the State report card in 1999, Chardon Schools has consistently ranked in the top 10% of districts across the state. Chardon High School's composite ACT score is 24 compared to the state average of 21.8. The graduation rate is 92%. In 2014 the district implemented a 1:1 technology initiative where every student in grades 3-12 is provided a Chromebook. Lower grades have access to iPad and Chromebooks from classroom carts.

Middle and High School students have a variety of extracurricular offerings. At CMS students can participate in Student Council, National Junior Honor Society, Power of The Pen, Science Olympiad, Conference Athletics, Drama Club, Teen Institute, Chess Club, and Math 24 Competition. Chardon High School students have their choice of Student Council, NHS, Academic Teams, Conference Athletics, Drama, Foreign Language and Art Clubs, Show Choir, Marching Band, Science Olympiad, Envirothon, Rotary Interact, Newspaper and Yearbook.

From the moment students walk into their Kindergarten class to the moment they graduate with their diplomas in hand, Chardon Schools strives to offer them more.
